SPECIAL MESSAGE TO THE POPULATIONS OF THE NORTH-WEST AND SOUTH-WEST REGIONS REGARDING REGISTRATION ON ELECAM ELECTORAL ROLLS FOR THE 2025 ELECTIONS.

Dear brothers and sisters of the North-West and South-West, the human, material and psychological consequences of the civil war ongoing in the two regions of our country, Cameroon, for almost eight years are disastrous.

CRM has a constant and publicly known political position on this national drama. This position rejects separatism, which it considers to be an extreme, although understandable, reaction to the autism, brutality and the use of force by those in power in the face of your demands which were completely legitimate initially. Our unchanged position since the start of the crisis is that it is not through arms nor in an armed confrontation between the National Army and armed separatist groups that the legitimate political problems of Anglophones can be resolved effectively and sustainably, because, It must be recalled that these problems are the consequence of the poor political management of Reunification.

For the CRM, which federalist convictions have been clearly affirmed throughout the evolution of the conflict, it is through justice, an Inclusive Dialogue open to all, including armed groups, and dealing with the central question of the form of the State that we can, together, rebuild peace in our country and lay solid foundations for our common history.

Since 2019, hundreds of our members, Political Hostages of the regime in place, have paid, alongside hundreds of Anglophone political prisoners, a heavy price for this political position. Like certain Anglophone political prisoners, CRM Political Hostages died in inhumane conditions, in jail or free, for their opinions.

In addition to the choice by voters to reject or maintain the dictatorial, kleptocratic and irresponsible ruling of the country by the CPDM regime, one of the major issues of the next elections in our country will be the quality of the political programmes of the parties and candidates for an in-depth resolution of the thorny question of the return of peace to the

Anglophone regions.

On this particular point, voters will have to choose between the Peace through Justice programme at the end of a truly Inclusive Dialogue dealing with all important political issues and in particular the form of the State, proposed by the CRM, and that of the military solution, the maintenance of centralisation, the denial of justice and the stifling arrogance that the CPDM power imposes on our country.

In order to give you, the citizen, power to impose your choice during these crucial elections for peace, stability and the future of our country, you must be registered on the ELECAM electoral lists, go and vote when the time comes. , monitor and defend your votes. This is why I invite you, dear brothers and sisters of the scarred and bereaved Anglophone regions, the internally and externally displaced people of these regions, the members of the diaspora to register, in numbers, on the electoral lists, so that together, on due time, by our massive vote, we would democratically take control of the Parliament and Councils and put an end to 43 years of leadership of Mr Paul BIYA with an irrevocable sanction vote during the presidential election. Join the general mobilisation for the registration on electoral lists, this formidable momentum driven by the thirst for change that everyone can observe across our country and in its diaspora.
